



LOCAL ATTRACTIONS AND ACTIVITIES



ALAMO

For over 300 years, the Alamo has been a crossroads for Texas history. Here the Spanish colonization first took hold and Mexico armed its independence. Yet most come to see the place where a small band of Texans held out for thirteen days against General Antonio López de Santa Anna. The memories of James Bowie, David Crockett, and William B. Travis are as powerful today as when the Texan Army under Sam Houston shouted “Remember the Alamo!” at the battle of San Jacinto in 1836.
